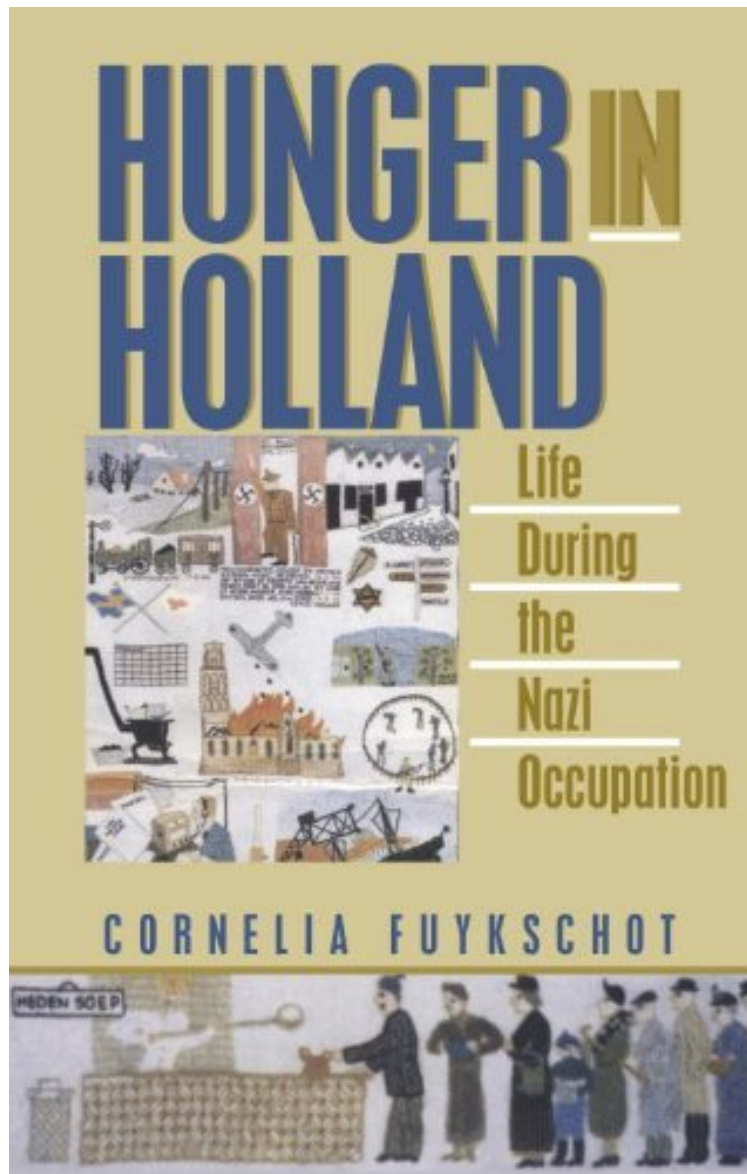

during WW2. She describes the struggle to keep warm, clothed, and nourished as basic supplies became increasingly scarce. The focus is a personal and familial one as she recalls the events that impacted on her parents and younger sister, and to some extent neighbours and school chums. Hardship abounds but triumph is definite in the satisfying ending of liberation by Canadian troops in 1944.
