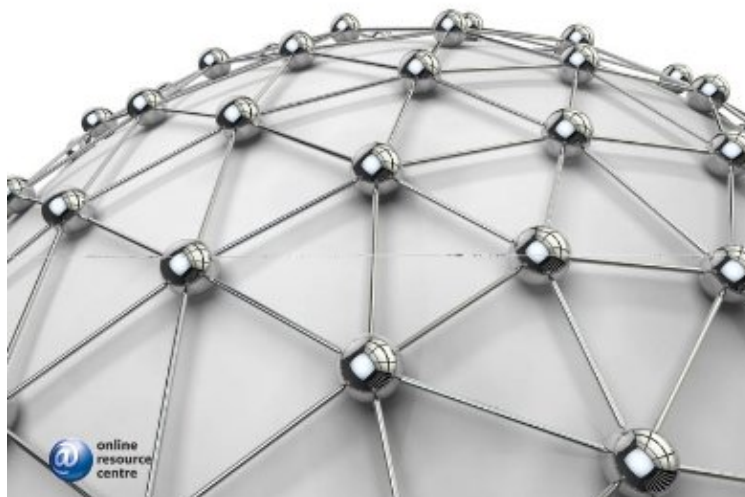

Nach fast hundert Jahren als halbwegs eigenständige Disziplin ist der Kampf der Theorien im vollen Gange - von wenigen Inseln eines unreflektierten "Realismus" abgesehen. Entsprechend leicht parteiisch mit Ansage sind die einzelnen Artikel. Aus klassisch-realistischer Sicht wird etwa als Erstes Kenneth Waltz' Neorealismus zerfleischt.Dieses Sammelbuch ist offensichtlich als Lehrbuch fr einen umfanglichen Kurs zur Theorie der Internationalen Beziehungen konzipiert. Es gibt Fragen zur Eigenberpfung und gbe sogar eine Ressourcenseite im Netz dazu. Um da wirklich alle Ressourcen wahrnehmen zu knnen, muss man sich erst sehr aufwändig

(Kundenrepresentantin kontaktieren, lange Formulare, Nachfragen la "wie viele genau werden dieses Buch kaufen" etc.) als Hochschul-Lehrkraft ausweisen, und die Powerpoints setzt man dann besser so nicht ein. Da ist eine grundstzlich progressive Idee nicht durchdacht worden. Wie in S. Schieders berblicks-IR-Sammelband ist gerade der eigene Artikel des Herausgebers nicht immer vernnftig durchlektoriert. Die angelschsische Zitier-Sitte la "Smith 2002" bedingt ferner, die Erstverffentlichung (mit) ins Verzeichnis zu nehmen, damit die Geistesgeschichte im Datum auch abgebildet wird. Das ist zumeist nicht der Fall. An den Rndern des Buchs ist etwas Platz fr Notizen, doch ist es angenehm dicht (und in britischer Schreibweise) gesetzt. Nach einer Einfhrung drfen verschiedene Vertreter "ihre" Theorievariante kurz vorstellen und bewerben. Und auch wenn das Buch einen gewissen Umfang hat: Dadurch, dass sehr viele Richtungen auftreten drfen, wird es schon sehr gedrngt. Es wird schon hufig auf Aufstze etc. weiterverwiesen. Doch "mal eben lesen" ist wohl nicht, selbst fr jemanden, der sich mit dem Thema schon einmal beschftigt hat. The authors make the ever growing body of IR knowledge understandable for the bewildered students without oversimplifying the theories and the academic debates around them, as many other introductory texts do. The authors help the reader not only to get familiarised with the body of IR knowledge, but to get an insightful overview of them, whereby independent individual reasoning is stimulated. The first 3 chapters (i.e. Introduction, Chapter 1 and 2) are most welcome since they deal in a clear language with often disregarded but essential matters of serious analysis, like: practical use of IR theories, ontology, epistemology, and normative roles. I met many master students colleagues studying political science and international relations having no clue of what "epistemology" or "ontology" are and why what hides behind these unusual words is of crucial importance for any type of political scientist. One may not agree with some assertions made in the book, like those regarding the possibility of a unified theory in IR in my case, but the arguments are logical and sturdy, thus obliging the reader to great intellectual labour to refute them in a similar grounded manner. I did not read the whole book yet, just the first five chapters, but as soon as I will finish to study it, I would add impressions in this description. For the advanced international relations readers I would recommend the Sage "Handbook of International Relations", 2d. edition, edited by Walter Carlsnaes, Thomas Risse and Beth A. Simmons.
