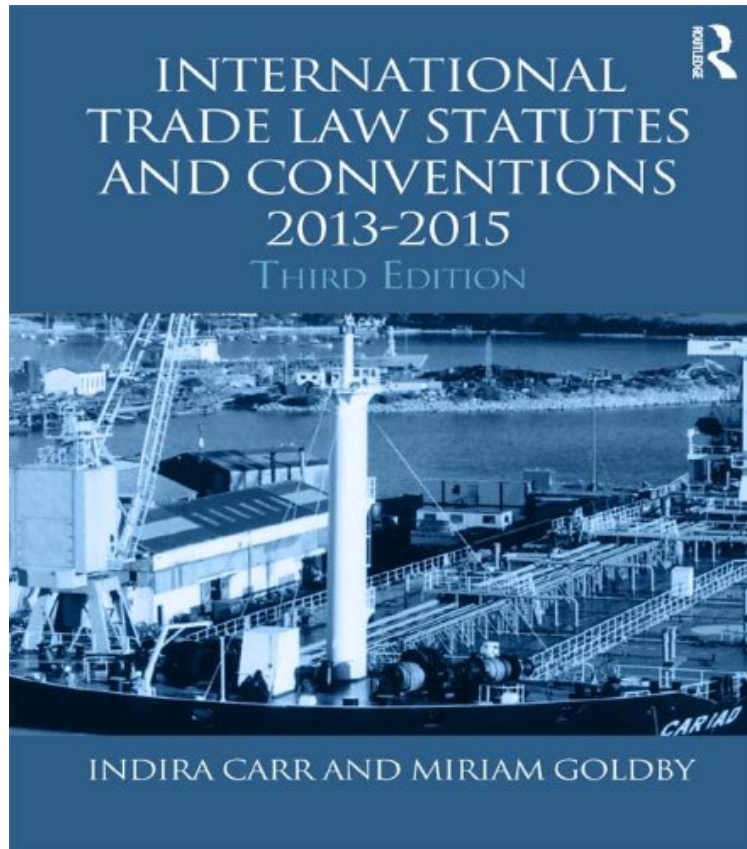

Presented in handy paperback format, this useful volume of almost 700 pages contains five sections to include statutes statutory instruments European Union materials conventions (there are over forty of these) and Rules and Model Laws (six of these sourced from UNCITRAL). In addition, there are almost forty additional pages of similar materials at the front of the book. For further ease of use, there is an index of over twenty pages at the back, making it reasonably easy to look up particular items of information. Note that this is the third edition of this useful work of reference -- which attests to its popularity and the expertise of its authors. Indira Carr is Professor of Law at the University of Surrey and Miriam Goldby is Lecturer in Insurance and Commercial Law at Queen Mary, University of London. Interestingly, they have developed the book in response to feedback from lecturers and students, to produce a text that is suitable for examination use. Note also that there is a most useful companion website. If you are a student of international trade law, this book does offer you a clear advantage, particularly in the run-up to exams. The collection contains material available to the authors up to 1 June 2013.
