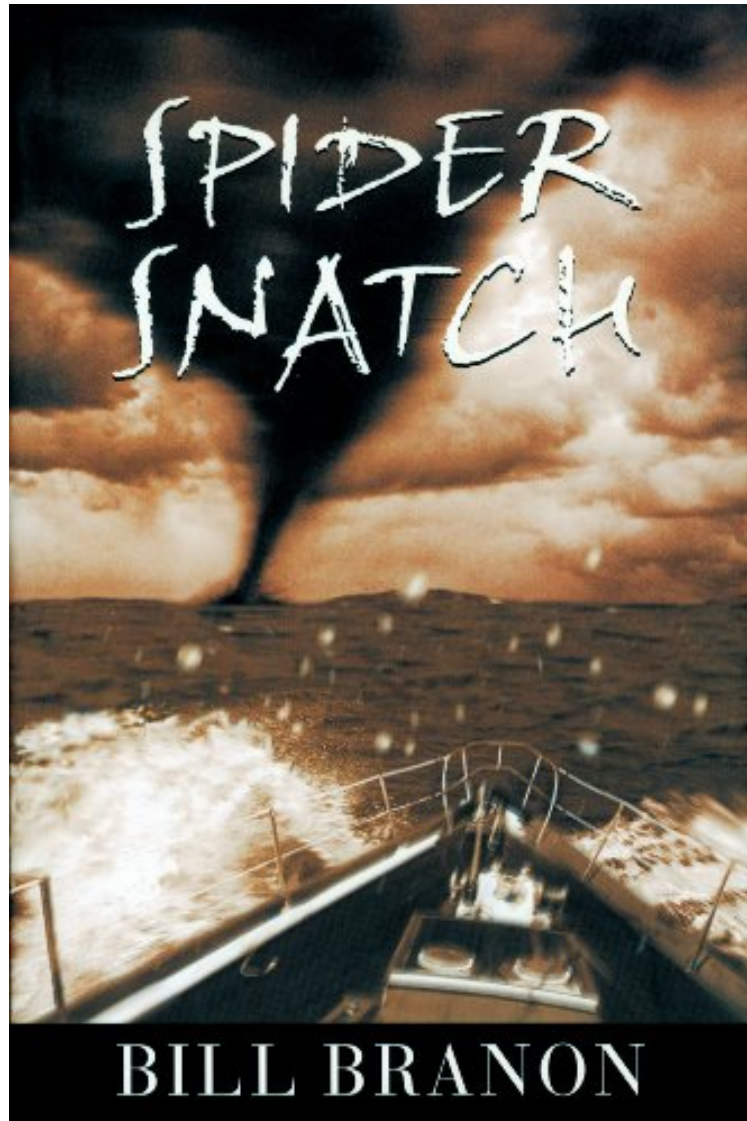

When I launched Huntington Press in the early 90s, I could only look on longingly as great authors from our own backyard took their manuscripts to the big New York publishing houses. They had to. There was no Internet, no , little hope for a regional press to solve the distribution conundrum and secure shelf space. Bill Branon was the hometown author I most coveteda Hartford, Connecticut native living in Las Vegas whod electrified the book world with his eerily prescient tale of the bombing of an IRS office in Let Us Prey, followed up by the chilling set-in-Las Vegas Devils Hole, both bestsellers for HarperCollins. That was then. Todays e-tech has made it possible for Branon to bring his third action-thriller to the hometown house.
