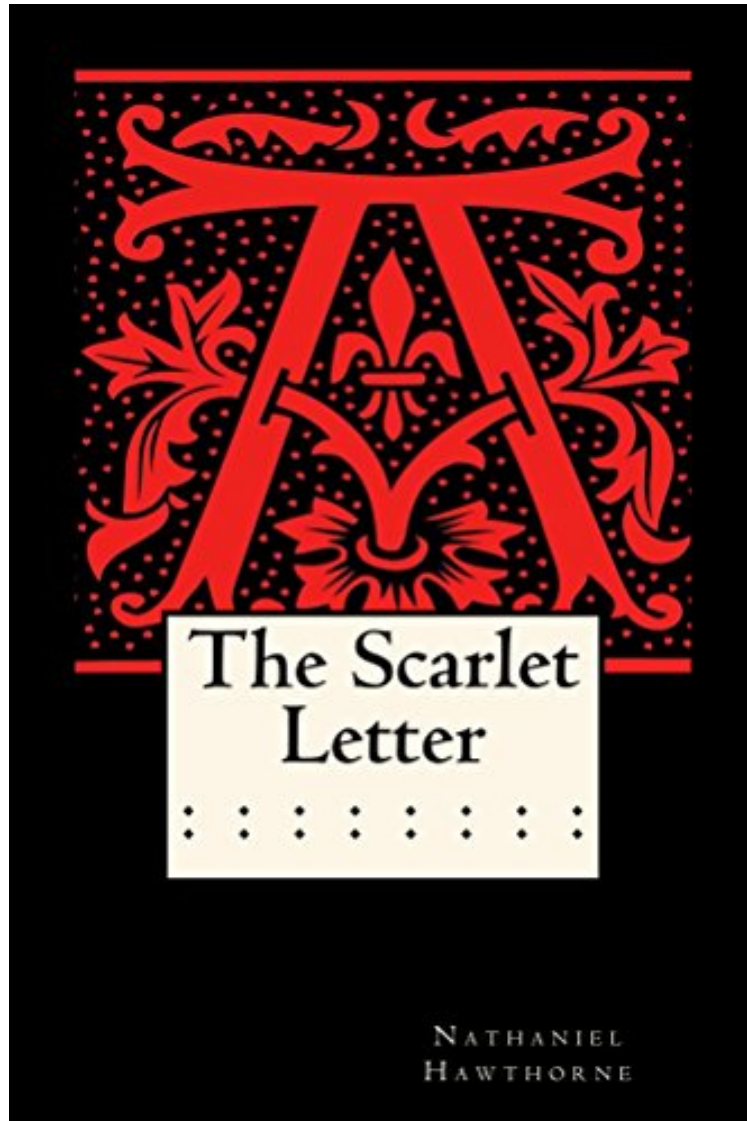

Da ich (fischlicherweise) davon ausging, dass jede Ausgabe des Scarlet Letter den vollndigen Originaltext enthlt,

Wählte ich aufgrund der optischen Gestaltung die im Skye Ryan Verlag erschienene Edition. Da die Einleitung die Erzählung einrahmt, aber nicht Teil der eigentlichen Geschichte ist, fiel mir beim ersten Lesen gar nicht auf, dass ein erheblicher Teil fehlte. Erst als ich eine der Analysefragen für den Kurs bearbeiten wollte, wurde deutlich, dass die Geschichte um Hester Prynne (früher gewöhnlich) durch die Introductory eingeleitet wird. Ich war also dazu gezwungen, auf die 40(!) fehlenden Seiten über das Internet zuzugreifen (aufgrund des abgelaufenen Urheberrechts ist dies zum Glück möglich). Das Buch sieht gut aus, besser als Durchschnitt - jedoch musste ich feststellen, dass diese Ausgabe KEINE Seitenzahlen hat. Leider kann ich als Student keine Ausgabe in der Universität benutzen, aus der ich leider nicht zitieren kann. Fehlkauf - daher zurück. ISBN-10: 14921515484 von 7 Kunden fanden die folgende Rezension hilfreich. Ugh! Von Collaroy Beach Ich kann mich den anderen Rezensenten nur anschließen - dieses Buch zu lesen ist eine Strafe! Es ist lang und voller endloser Beschreibungen der abgrundtiefen Seelenqualen der Charaktere, so da ich zum Schluss nur noch quergelesen habe - und selbst dann war es bestenfalls langweilig. Ich muss dazu sagen, da ich bereits einige Penguin Classics gelesen habe, u. a. auch Shakespeare's "Much ado about nothing", und sprachlich auch schon Schwierigeres hinter mich gebracht habe, aber "The scarlet letter" ist, wie der Engländer sagen würde, "a tremendous bore". Um so enttäuschter war ich, weil ich dachte, da die Beschreibung eines Ehebruchs im puritanischen Neuengland des 18. Jahrhunderts eigentlich sehr interessant sein müsste - weit gefehlt, ist es nicht. Dieses Buch ist wahrscheinlich nur so berühmt geworden, weil es für die damalige Zeit vermutlich einen ziemlichen Skandal verursacht hat. Ich habe es unter Aufbietung meiner gesamten Willenskraft zuendegelesen, aber danach habe ich einen Stauseifer der Erleichterung von mir gegeben und dieses Buch gegen die Wand geworfen. Und wenn ein Englischlehrer so etwas seiner Klasse vorsetzt, muss man sich auch nicht wundern, wenn keiner mehr lesen möchte - da wäre mir damals auch einiges vergangen!

From School Library Journal Grade 9-Up Nathaniel Hawthorne's classic novel of Puritanism giving rise to twisted gender politics, hypocrisy, and strength of character in the face of public scorn is well realized in this reading by Annie Wauters. She gives individual tone and rhythm to each of the main characters, while keeping the passages of narrative relatively uninflected. While this suits the author's own sometimes dry writing, it means that listeners must get to the second hour before the story truly gets underway. Since this lengthy forepart fits almost entirely onto the first disk, and each chapter is clearly marked as to track number on the packaging, it is possible to simply skip ahead rather than give up what becomes a delightfully lively listening experience once the romance gets going. Because the reading adheres so entirely to the print in spirit as well as in word, this is an excellent choice for students who cannot access print or who would like to accomplish college prep reading while undertaking other activities.
