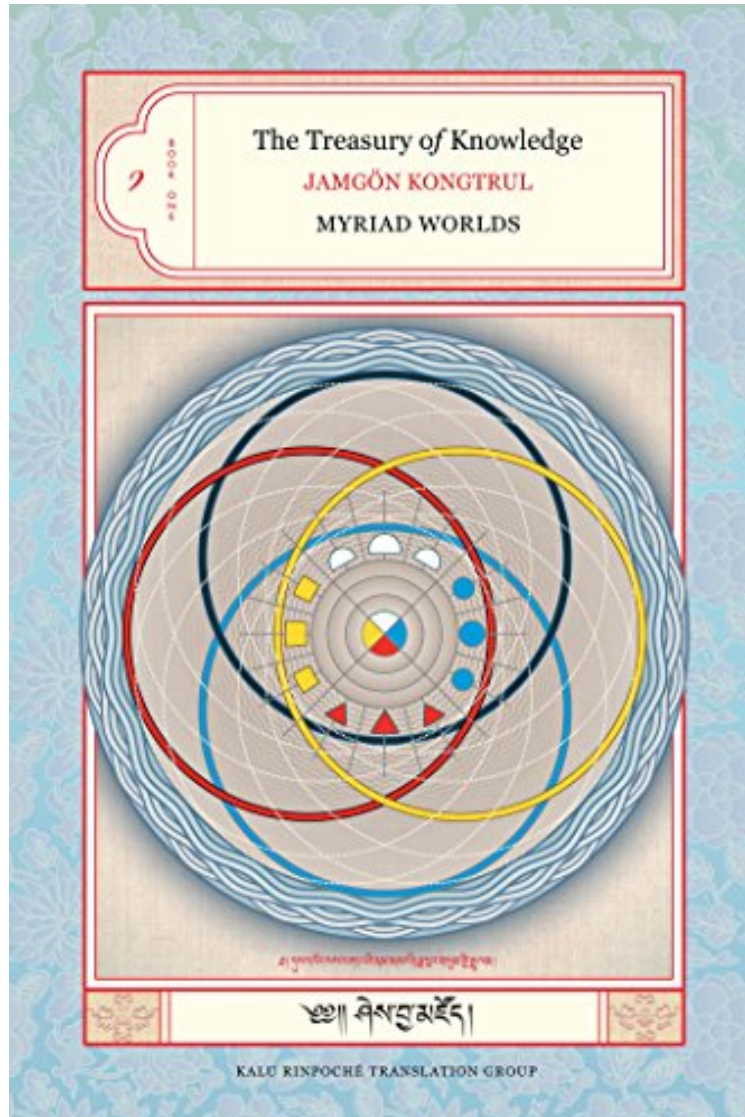

Though brand new, it is already a treasured

resource. Many of us have or will have tremendous gratitude toward the translators and publishers. Translated by a committee, but relatively user-friendly anyway, the book appears targeted toward scholars and toward practitioners who have also devoted a lot of time to reading primary sources (at least translated primary sources). This translation hits at a middle ground between the 'purist specialist' and mass market audiences. Jamgon Kongtrul Lodro Taye was a superstar of the Rime ('without sect') Tibetan ecumenical movement at the end of last century.
