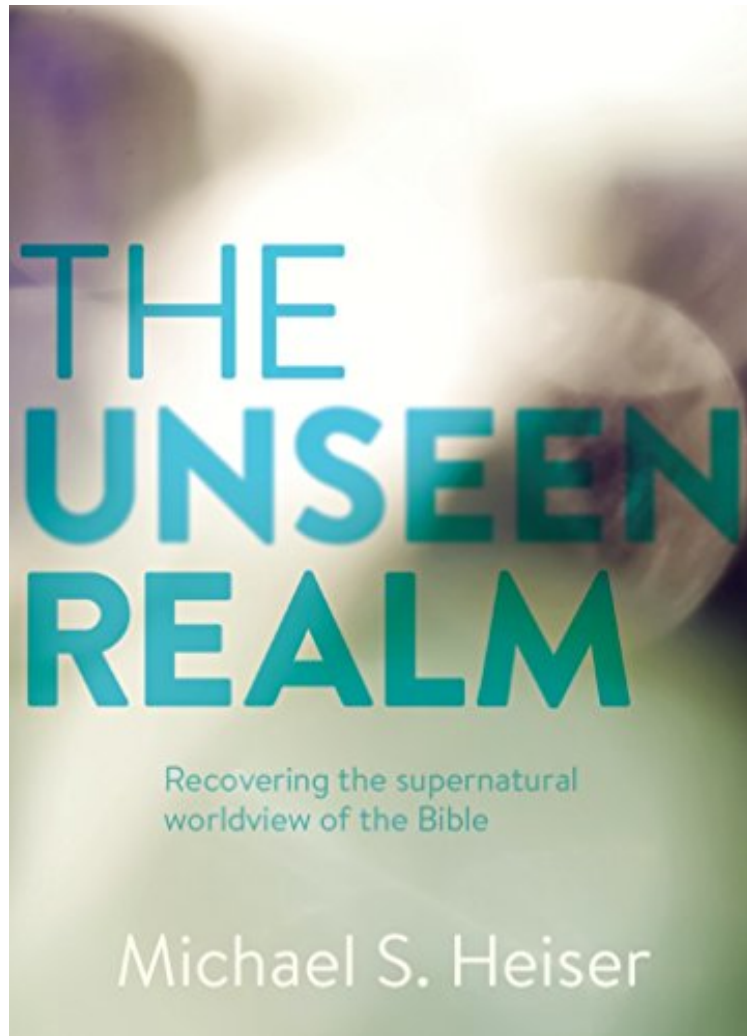

 Groartig! Von Buchliebhaber Dr Heiser schafft es, dem Leser Zugang zu akademischer Theologie so zu vermitteln, dass man sich wirklich selber ein Bild machen kann. Und zwar ein Bild von dem, was wirklich in der Bibel steht. er betreibt sorgfältige Wortstudien, und eröffnet dem Leser zusätzlich den Wissenshintergrund, die die Leute damals hatten - vor allem zur Zeit des Zweiten Tempels. So werden scheinbar rätselhafte Stellen wie 1. Mose 6, 1-4 plötzlich klar wie Klossbrhe, und das Ganze - die biblische Geschichte, was Gott mit den Menschen vorhat und wer da noch so im Spiel ist - macht plötzlich noch mehr Sinn! Er eröffnet so ganz neue Schätze in der Bibel, und es stimmt, wie es im Klappentext steht: Man liest die Bibel seitdem nicht mehr so wie früher! - Also nicht mehr so eingeschränkt und halbinformiert. Und was man dabei entdeckt, haut einen wirklich aus den Socken. übrigens nix mit billiger Bibel- und Textkritik. Evangelikale müssen keine Angst haben. Im Gegenteil: Was einem da und dort an liebgewonnenen Berzeugungen der "Lehre" vielleicht weggenommen wird, wird einem 10fach wiedergegeben. Aber diesmal textbasiert. Und man merkt, dass die Bibelkritik wie man sie heutzutage zu hren bekommt, intellektuell seicht wie eine Pfütze ist. Heiser rollt das alles einem lockeren Tonfall auf, dem man aber anmerkt, dass er seine Sache ernst meint.
