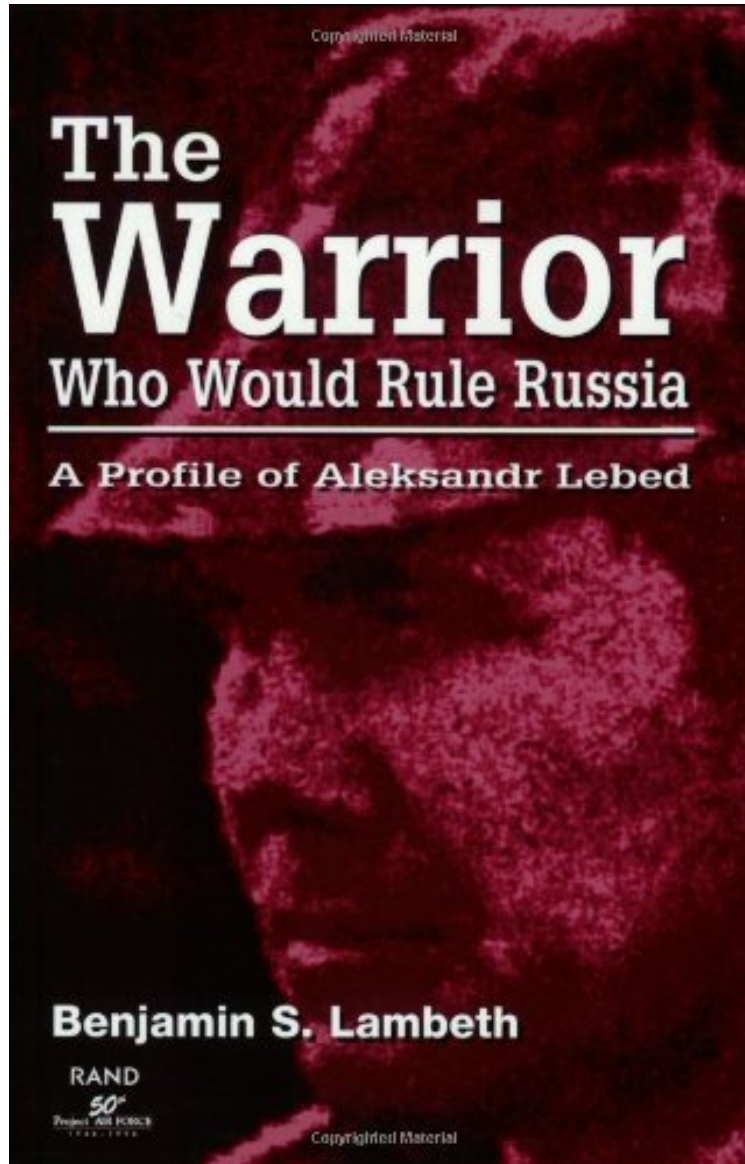

political and economic chaos of post-Soviet Russia. His early years are sketched in a few words, leaving many unanswered questions about his character and early development, but his expressed opinions and political maneuverings are charted here in a way which provides some illumination. He seems neither the Russian Napoleon some fear nor the saintly figure seen by the simpler Russian voter, but, possibly, a man with whom the West could do business. The book is necessarily dated, and doesn't cover Lebed's dismissal as Yeltsin's national security advisor, nor his relatively obscure more recent activities, but is of value nonetheless as scarce material on a man with whom the West may yet reckon.
